We are seeking support for the revision of the BA Minor in Economics Degree program. We would like to add new course options to this program. Changes to the program are shown below. In order to make the BA minor in Economics program more accessible to our students, the department of economics is proposing additional courses. These courses would provide added choices for students and give them more flexibility.

Rationale and Support

Economics is a broad field that covers many areas including microeconomics, macroeconomics, economic theory, international economics, economic development, and more. To meet the diverse needs and areas of interest of our students, and to provide them with courses from various areas of studies, the department of economics is proposing to add additional upper level courses to this program. Accordingly, the department approved the inclusion of several new economics choices. The plan is to offer two 3000 level courses and one 4000 level course in the fall and spring semesters. Students will be informed about planned economics course offerings to facilitate their planning.

Course developers have designed many of the newly added courses such that they can be taken with only principles as prerequisites. This promotes flexibility and a seamless course progression for students.

The proposed implementation date for this program is Fall 2011.

This program change meets all conditions required for the Bachelor of Arts degree format and is supported by the department of economics. This change was approved by the School of Business Curriculum Committee and Faculty Council.

The department of economics would like to ask for the following two changes to the Business Administration Diploma Program to be considered:

1. Removing 'Canadian Studies' from the Group B electives.

Rationale and Support: 'Canadian Studies' is currently listed as an optional course to fulfill the elective requirements in Group B within the Business Administration Diploma. However, no such course is listed in the Kwantlen calendar. Canadian Studies is an AA program at Kwantlen, however, it is not a course that students can take. We would therefore ask to remove this misleading option.

2. Adding MATH 1130 (Calculus for Life Sciences) as a substitute for MATH 1140.

Rationale and Support: As per the SFU calendar (<http://business.sfu.ca/bba/apply/cat2.php>) one of SFU's MATH 151, MATH 154 or MATH 157 are required courses. We identify MATH 1140 (equivalent to SFU MATH 157) as the course to take, but we also identify MATH 1120 (equivalent to SFU MATH 151) as an acceptable option. Kwantlen's MATH 1130 also transfers to SFU as MATH 154. To be consistent with SFU's requirements, we would like to ask for MATH 1130 to be added to the list of mathematics course options. This would allow students to substitute MATH 1120 **or MATH 1130** for MATH 1140.

MATH 1140 is Calculus for Business Applications, and MATH 1120 is Differential Calculus.

POLICY

TITLE: Academic Schedule

APPROVED BY: Board of Governors

EFFECTIVE: June 2005

RELATED POLICIES:

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to assist in the establishment of an academic schedule that meets the needs of the educational programming at Kwantlen Polytechnic University. The *University Act* Section 35.2(6)(h) states that “The senate of a special purpose teaching university must advise the board, and the board must seek advice from the senate, on the development of educational policy for the setting of the academic schedule.”

SCOPE

This policy applies to all students enrolled in Kwantlen Polytechnic University courses or programs while engaged in educational activity either on or off campus.

PRINCIPLES

The following principles should be considered in setting the academic schedule.

Length or Duration

1. The number of working days between the end of one teaching period, including exams, and the beginning of the next teaching period will normally be a determining factor used in making recommendations on the academic schedule.

2. For semester-based programs or courses the length or duration of the semester may reflect the provincial range for similar program types.
3. For non semester-based programs or courses the length or duration of the program/course may reflect the provincial range for similar program types.

Exam Schedule

1. For semester-based programs or courses final exams should be scheduled commencing after a one (1) day break between the last scheduled day of classes and run for eight (8) working days (including Saturdays).
2. For non semester-based programs or courses final exams should be scheduled according to program requirements.

Reading Break

A reading break, scheduled in the spring semester, will not normally result in a lengthening of that semester.

Statutory Holidays

The impact of statutory holidays in any given semester should be considered when establishing the length of programs and courses.

Other

1. An effort will be made to include dates important to students, such as withdrawal dates.
2. The academic schedule will be developed by the Office of the Registrar based on the principles herein. On behalf of the Board of Governors, the Senate, through the Policy Review Committee, will monitor the academic schedule for the purpose of affirming that it aligns with the principles identified in the policy.
3. The academic schedule for the following academic year will normally be presented to the Policy Review Committee in September and reported on at the October meeting of Senate and the Board of Governors.
