HONOURS DEGREE OPTION

To apply for the Honours option, you must have completed at least 90 credits towards the degree at the time of application, and are expected to maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.3 and a B+ in each of PSYC 3300, 3400, and 4400.

Applications to the Honours program are to be submitted to the Psychology Departmental Assistant (Surrey Campus: D 226A) for review by the Honours Committee in May of each year and must include a signature from a Faculty member in the Psychology Department indicating that they are willing to act as the student's Honours Supervisor.

In addition to the 120 required credits for the degree, Honours students must complete all of the following:

- PSYC 5000 Honours Thesis I (6 credits)
- PSYC 5010 Honours Thesis II (6 credits)

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENT FOR BAA

An Associate of Arts Degree in Psychology (or equivalent), or near completion of the Associate of Arts in Psychology with a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 3.0 is required for entry to the third year of the degree program.

Note

Where space permits students with less than a 3.0 CGPA (but not less than 2.67) may be considered on a case by case basis for admission.

In addition to Kwantlen's standard application start date, students will be considered for admission based on the date their application is submitted. Third-semester students should apply on the condition they will have completed their AA degree by the fourth semester or by the end of the summer semester. Students must also have completed:

- PSYC 2300* (Applied Statistics) with a grade of at least B (3.0)
- PSYC 2400 (Experimental Psychology: Research Methodology) with a grade of at least B (3.0)
- PSYC 2330 (Social Psychology)
- PSYC 2385 (Cognition)

¹Upper level PSYC courses offered through the Bachelor of Arts Program at Kwantlen may NOT be used to meet upper level PSYC Elective requirements for the Bachelor of Applied Arts Psychology. BA PSYC courses may, however, be used within the General Elective requirements.

HOW TO MEET THE LIBERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

The Liberal Education requirement for the BAA states that the following need to be completed by graduation.

- three credits of first year English (Associate of Arts)
- six credits of liberal education from courses within or outside the core discipline, three credits of which must be third or fourth year liberal education
- nine credits of liberal education from outside the of the core discipline

In order to evaluate your courses against the Liberal Education requirement, you need to take a look at all the courses you have taken so far in both the Associate of Arts & BAA Psychology Program. The following addresses each point one at a time:

1. ENGL 1100 or 1110 in the Associate of Arts meet this requirement.
2. According to the Liberal Education approved course list, the completion of the required PSYC 3500 and 4500 satisfies this portion of the requirement.
3. Besides ENGL 1100 (or 1110), and besides PSYC 3500 and 4500, look back at your courses to see if you have three more NON-PSYC courses off of the Liberal Education approved course list. If you do not, use the three elective spots in the BAA program to ensure that you have these complete.
