Eagles Golf Open 2011 Season in Kamloops



METRO VANCOUVER – The Pacific Western Athletic Association's (PAC WEST) 2011-2012 season teed off in Kamloops this past weekend (Sept. 17-18) and hosted 52 of BC's male and female varsity golfers. Joining the Eagles ranks for the first tournament was first-year Jesse Reichelt (Langley). Reichelt was the lowest scoring Eagle over the 18 holes, breaking 80 on both days and finishing with an individual score of 155 (78, 77).

When play wrapped up play on Sunday afternoon, the Eagles produced a combined team score of 648 (321, 327), placing eighth in the team competition; 27 strokes behind 7th place. Despite a disappointing start to the varsity golf season, head coach Keith Westover was impressed with the nose-to-the-grindstone work ethic of his team. "As a former competitive player, I know how difficult it is to be motivated to get out and practice after a bad round, but each player dutifully went to the practice ground to iron out their swing or game issues right after play," said Westover. "Hopefully this will pay dividends for us next week in Kelowna."

The team heads to Kelowna this weekend for the second PAC WEST tournament, hosted by UBC Okanagan. Grant Steinberg (Langley) will join Jesse Reichelt, Thomas Rose (Surrey) and Paul Rempel (Surrey) to round out the Eagles tournament roster. To view the PAC WEST results, visit:
