



What Does It Mean If You Are...

...In Good Academic Standing?

You have achieved a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 or higher. There are no restrictions on your registration priority.

...Placed on Academic Warning?

You have now completed at least 9 credits and have achieved a CGPA of less than 2.00. You cannot repeat any course for which a grade of C or better has been assigned. **You register very late**, after returning students in good academic standing and new students.

...Placed on Academic Probation?

You have previously been on Academic Warning, have now completed at least 18 credits and have achieved a CGPA of less than 2.00. You cannot repeat any course for which a grade of C or better has been assigned. **You register very late**, after returning students in good academic standing and new students.

...Required to Withdraw?

You have previously been placed on Academic Probation, have now completed at least 27 credits and have achieved both a Term Grade Point Average (TGPA) and CGPA of less than 2.00. Normally, **you will be required to withdraw for at least six months, or, effectively, two semesters**. You can, where applicable, register in Qualifying Studies (upgrading) courses during that time. You must submit an Educational Plan in order to be considered for re-admission. If or when you are re-admitted, **you register very late**, after returning students in good academic standing and new students.

...Placed on Academic Suspension?

You have previously been Required to Withdraw, have been re-admitted on Academic Probation, have now completed at least 36 credits and have achieved both a TGPA and CGPA of less than 2.00. Normally, **you will be suspended for at least one year**. You must submit an Educational Plan in order to be considered for re-admission. If or when you are re-admitted, **you register very late**, after returning students in good academic standing and new students.
